Welcome back! We hope you have all had a lovely break.

English: We are starting the term with our Poetry unit, reading a variety of Poems such as 'Question time' and 'The Gruffalo' by Julia Donaldson. We will then be moving on to a narrative unit.

We will continue with our daily phonics lessons, following Little Wandle, and we will have three guided reading sessions each week, focusing on decoding, prosody and comprehension. We will also send the book home on a Friday for you to read with your child. We will also be completing whole class reading sessions twice a week, focusing on comprehension, fluency and expression. Here are some books we will be reading in our whole class reading sessions:



In class, we will also have a class chapter book which we will read daily. The children help choose the next book each time and class book time is one of my favourite parts of the day!

Grouping in 10's, number line to 50 and one more/one less.

We will be following the CPA (concrete-pictorial-abstract) approach to build competency and will be ensuring that there are problem solving and reasoning opportunities within each lesson to support our mastery approach.

Homework

- We would like your child to read to you at home at least 4 times a week. Please make a brief note or sign in your child's planner each time you have listened to them read. We will check planners on a Friday. Your child will be allocated the book that they will be reading in their guided reading sessions and a choice library book to bring home each week.
- As you will be aware, research has shown that children who listen to five books a day, arrive at school having heard around 1.4 million words more than children who are not read to. This has a huge impact on vocabulary, speech and reading development. We love to hear of any books your child has enjoyed listening to at home. Please feel free to make a note of them in the planner too.
- A piece of homework will be given out each Friday linked to our phonics work. It will really support your child to work through the sheet each week. You do not need to return the sheet to school.
